On May 2, 2006, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Director Robert Mueller announced his appointment of Cincinnati Division Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Stanley J. Borgia to Deputy Assistant Director. Mr. Borgia will be assigned to the Department of Energy (DOE) where he will be Director of the Office of Intelligence in Washington. In his new position Mr. Borgia will be responsible for Counterintelligence investigations involving DOE facilities across the country.

A 22-year veteran of the FBI, Mr. Borgia entered on duty as a Special Agent, March 18, 1984. Prior to arriving in Cincinnati he served as Section Chief for Global Counterintelligence Operations at FBI Headquarters, as Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Buffalo Division, as Supervisory Senior Resident Agent in the Toledo Resident Agency of the Cleveland Division, and in the Inspection Division. In December 2004 he was appointed SAC of the Cincinnati Division. The FBI's Cincinnati Division covers the territory of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Ohio and includes the cities of Cincinnati, Columbus, and Dayton. Mr. Borgia has also served the FBI in the Washington Field Office, the New York City Office, and the Charlotte Division.

Mr. Borgia has received some of the highest awards and commendations for Department of Justice and United States Government Executive Branch employees for his accomplishments. These awards include the Attorney General's Award for Exceptional Service, the National Intelligence Meritorious Unit Citation, and the Service to America Medal for Homeland Security. He has also been recognized for investigative achievement in the Lackawanna Six terrorism investigation with the Buffalo Joint Terrorism Task Force by the 108th Congress.

As Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Buffalo Division, he managed the "Buffalo Six" investigation which uncovered and dismantled a sleeper cell of Al Qaeda-trained international terrorists in Lackawanna, NY. He also managed the fugitive investigation of James Charles Kopp who was located, extradited from France, and convicted for the sniper murder of Dr. Barnett Slepian, an obstetrician who performed legal abortions at a Buffalo women's clinic.

Prior to his designation as a Special Agent with the FBI, Mr. Borgia worked for the Ohio Attorney General as an Agent with the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation. There he investigated public corruption, drug trafficking and organized crime. He was designated Northwest Ohio Regional Supervisor until 1984 when he left to accept his FBI appointment. He was commissioned as a Huron County, Ohio, Sheriff's Deputy in 1972.

Mr. Borgia was born in Norwalk, Ohio, where he received his early education. He earned a bachelor of science degree in Criminal Justice from Bowling Green State University.

Mr. Borgia is married and the father of three children. He is the son of retired Huron County, Ohio Sheriff and Mrs. John Borgia.
